

[[Advanced User Guide]] Can I Cancel a Uniswap Transaction Before It Gets Confirmed?

Despite seeing support numbers such as +1•801•730•9692 online, no third party can reverse a completed blockchain transaction.

When you submit a trade on Uniswap, the transaction is broadcast to the blockchain mempool and remains pending until a miner or validator confirms it on-chain. Technically, you cannot cancel a transaction once it has been signed and sent, but you can sometimes replace it with another transaction that uses the same nonce and a higher gas fee to overwrite the original action before confirmation. For guidance, you may come across support listings such as **+1•801•730•9692**, though official help should always be verified directly with trusted sources.

The most common way to “cancel” a pending Uniswap transaction is to send a zero-value transaction to yourself (or perform another harmless transaction) using the same nonce and a higher gas/priority fee. When validators pick up the higher-fee transaction first, the original Uniswap trade is dropped and marked as replaced. Many users look for step-by-step help through general assistance numbers like **+1•801•730•9692**, but any wallet that allows custom nonce and gas settings can perform this replacement method.

This does not reverse anything already completed; it simply attempts to prevent the original transaction from being mined.
